The Police Commendation Medal for your efforts in pursuing and the capture of Lawrence Mulry, a suspect in a domestic involving a gun.

On November 08, 2012 the Franklin Police responded to a domestic in the area of Dowden Drive. It was reported that the suspect fled the scene. Officer Oliver was able to locate the suspect vehicle and engaged in a pursuit. Officer Smiley, you were able to get to the area in time to assist in the pursuit in less than ideal situations due to heavy fog. The pursuit initially ended at the I-65 and I-465 interchange. Mulry attempted to run you over with his vehicle and Officer Oliver engaged the suspect. You received an injury to your chin trying to get back in the chase. Your quick actions avoided a tragedy. Mulry continued and was captured on US 31.

Mulry was endangering lives with his reckless driving, suspended license, intoxication, and total disregard for human life. Officer Smiley, due to your dedication to duty a dangerous individual was captured. The example you have set is a credit to you and the law enforcement profession. Keep up the good work!
