Call to Order:

Ken Austin called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m.

Approval of Minutes:

Lee Hodgen made a motion to approve the July 8th, 2014 minutes as presented. Jake Sappenfield seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Old Business:

None.

New Business:

Economic Development Fee Proposals:

Discover Downtown Franklin:

Tara Payne, Executive Director of Discover Downtown Franklin, stated that she did not request a specific amount. She stated that the amount could be used for any of their events or activities.

Franklin Chamber of Commerce:

Janice Bullman, Director of the Franklin Chamber of Commerce, stated that they are going through a renovation at their building. They are requesting an amount to pay for a white board that is also interactive for their conference room. They are requesting \$7,500.

Franklin Education Connection:

No one was present from this organization.

Franklin Development Corporation:

Steve Woods, Vice President of the FDC, stated that the request will go to their administrative costs. The money would allow them to continue operating for another 6 months and would reduce their request to the City. Mayor Joe McGuinness stated that Josh DeArmitt will be taking Tony Wellings spot as Mr. Wellings has moved outside of the county.

Franklin Heritage, Inc.:

Rob Shilts, Executive Director of Franklin Heritage & Artcraft Theatre, stated that they are looking at a new shingle roof above the fly loft. The roof is at least 25 years old. The cost is going to be around \$24,000. A second project is a handicap ramp at 49 E. Madison Street. He stated they have been working with Atterbury Job Corp so they only need to pay for the materials, not labor. The third project is 48 E Madison Street. They are getting an office ready at that location so they could hire another employee.

Ms. Linke stated last year's amount given out was approximately \$12-\$14K. She stated that the County didn't bill last year so this year there is \$33K which includes all the fees from last year and half of this year. There will be another amount of \$10K or less later this year. She stated they will probably receive it at the end of December.

Mr. Schafstall stated that he has a professional relationship with the Franklin Development Corporation. Ms. Linke stated that she has ties with all of the groups except the Franklin Education Connection. John Ditmars stated that he is on the Franklin Development Corporation Board. Mr. Sappenfield stated that he has ties with all of them.

Mr. Sappenfield stated the Education Foundation has requested \$5,000. The rest of the money could be divided evenly between the remaining groups. Mr. Austin stated that the \$7,500 to the Chamber could be given in full. Mr. Sappenfield stated his understanding of the Education Connection is that there are 2 groups, one that helps to fund fieldtrips and projects, and a second group that runs Study Connections. The groups merged into the Education Foundation.

Mr. Woods stated the funds would go for FDC office costs, it would not be distributed as a loan or grant. Josh DeArmitt questioned which project the money for FHI would go to. Mr. Shilts stated they would have to decide which was needed first and the Executive Board and Board would decide.

Josh DeArmitt made a motion to approve \$7,500 to the Chamber, \$3,000 for the Franklin Education Connection, and \$7,500 for each of the other organizations. Lee Hodgen seconded the motion. Lee Hodgen-yes, Josh DeArmitt-yes, Ken Austin-yes. John Ditmars and Jake Sappenfield abstained.

Other Business:

Ms. Linke stated that Tony Wellings had been the secretary and that the position would need to be filled. Jake Sappenfield made a motion to nominate Josh DeArmitt as Secretary. Lee Hodgen seconded the motion. The motion carried.

• The Franklin Chamber of Commerce is requesting funds for a Sharp AQUOS BOARD. Currently, the Franklin Chamber is undergoing a renovation of its facility, including the conference room. This meeting room; now limited to a table and chairs, will soon become a more functional meeting space for the Chamber members and the community at-large with the proposed addition of an interactive whiteboard/Sharp AQUOS BOARD. The Sharp AQUOS BOARD is designed for communication in a wide range of contexts. This whiteboard includes software that enables multifaceted wireless communication, including pressure sensitive touch pens that allow writing with effortless and uninterrupted flow. The Sharp AQUOS BOARD provides the opportunity to use the on-screen key pad to access the Internet and documents. The on-screen Internet display offers endless opportunities for viewers to access maps, census data, webinars and ANY information accessible through the World Wide Web!

The whiteboard can be used as a simple computer screen for videos, PowerPoint, Microsoft Excel and Word display as-well-as other unique features. The AQUOS BOARD will be used for the Chamber Basics training; committee meetings that need a larger display board and offer the opportunity to link up with Webinars and other training events. This new equipment will bring an added benefit to our membership by inviting them to use our conference room and the AQUOS BOARD. Additionally, City and County government; education institutions and community groups could use this tool in various ways to enhance their organizations' work – ultimately, *strengthen the City of Franklin by Linking Business with Community*.

The Request

Discover Downtown Franklin (DDF) is requesting the full amount of the Economic Development Fee, \$33,726.15, to assist with operational expenses, promote economic development, and to cover advertising expenses.

Our Mission

Discover Downtown Franklin, Inc. is a 501(c) 3 nonprofit organization whose mission is to create and maintain community traditions, celebrate the historic nature of downtown Franklin Indiana, and promote its uniqueness to central Indiana and the surrounding region. Through collaboration with various entities in the community, DDF encourages a healthy economic atmosphere in historic downtown Franklin. Discover Downtown Franklin strives to bring about economic, cultural and social transformation of downtown Franklin, primarily through active promotion, physical improvements, support of existing merchants, and active recruiting of new business establishments, by following the National Trust's National Main Street Center's approach.

Our Operations

Since its creation in 2005, DDF volunteers have drastically increased awareness about the downtown area through marketing materials, special events, programs, community exchanges, and other means. In 2013, DDF hired Tara Payne as a full-time executive director. Since then, the organization has grown tremendously with larger events, marketing efforts reaching all throughout Indiana and into other states, and more community participation by business owners, residents, and elected officials. Since November, the community recognizes DDF as an entity separate from the city, and is an organization that people know and love. Face Book has served as a tool for this recognition with an increase of over 1200 "likes" and partnerships are soaring.

With this large growth, the organization's operational expenses have grown as well. Our main source of income is from our promotional events. The events bring in revenue, but do not sufficiently cover the operational costs, growth of festivals, economic development demands, and advertising expenses.

Operational expenses include salaries, office supplies, professional development, business relations, payroll taxes, insurance, technology expenses, etc. Operational expenses have proven difficult to cover on our promotions alone. The money we earn on our festivals should go towards improving the festival for the following year. The City of Franklin awarded DDF \$15,000 for operational costs, but currently the Executive Director receives a salary of \$30,000 with no insurance or benefits. We certainly would like to offer more, but simply can't afford the increase. Tara has done a great job with sponsorship this year, but the same people are being asked for sponsorship by several different entities, which make it difficult for businesses to give. Estimated cost \$15,000.

Economic demands include host a community exchange for Indiana's National Main Street Center. This community exchange is a great way to bring other National Main Street Organizations to our city to promote economic development. Estimated cost \$5,000.

Advertising expenses include banners and signage to promote economic development by attracting people downtown. DDF engages local businesses in their events and promotes eating, playing and shopping local to visitors. The billboard on Fred Paris' building as you drive into town from US 31 was offered to us as an advertising avenue; we could include all of the events and festivals coming up in the downtown area. We would also like to put more money into our events. We would like to add fun elements to each event (4 total) in the kids activity area like a trampoline swing, a rock climbing wall, or even a petting zoo of some type. Estimated cost \$15,000.

Due to the expense of the proposed projects we are requesting the entire amount of the Economic Development Fee, \$33,726.15, to help assist us with these expenses. Receiving the Economic Development Fee would provide much needed funding in order to sustain our organization and increase the traffic in the downtown area.

The purpose of this letter is to formally request \$10,000 from the Economic Development Fees to provide further funding opportunities for the Franklin Development Corporation (FDC). In accordance with the request, the following information provides greater insight into our organization and mission.

Mission Statement

We are passionate about delivering Community Betterment, Primarily Through Economic Development.

FDC Board of Directors

Annual operating budget summarized by category

The annual operating budget for the Franklin Development Corporation is \$25,000. Legal and accounting expenses account for \$16,800 of the budget (67.2%). The balance pertains to insurance for our board of directors, phone, postage and loan servicing fees that are provided by a local bank.

Description of how funds would be used and for what

Funds received from the EDC would be used for the aforementioned FDC operating costs. In 2014, the Franklin City Council provided \$50,000 in Administrative Costs from their budget to fund the FDC. The EDC grant would provide additional time for the respective programs to succeed and further the FDC's desire to cover all operating costs independent of the local financial assistance.

Amount of funds requested and a prioritized detailed project budget

The FDC is requesting \$10,000 for Operating Costs. Since the introduction of the new FDC Board of Directors, significant cuts have been made to the budget to ensure more of every dollar is delivered back into the economic development of our community in the form of our primary programs (see below).

FDC Programs

- 1. **Residential Revolving Loan Fund** Provides low-interest loans to residents living in the Integrated Economic Development Area of Franklin who wish to improve the exterior of their property.
- 2. Commercial Revolving Loan Fund Provides lowinterest loans to businesses located in the Integrated Economic Development Area of Franklin who wish to improve the interior or exterior of their property.
- 3. **Downtown Façade Matching Grant** Provides direct, non-recoverable investment into Franklin's historic downtown for property owners to comply with Architectural Design Guidelines and improve the building's exterior façade.
- 4. Direct Investments / Housing Blight Targets houses within a specific geographic area that have been deemed a blight to the community. The FDC purchases these homes and works with private contractors to rehab the home back to City of Franklin standards. Ultimately, the homes will be sold and provide operating expenses for the FDC.

On behalf of the FDC Board of Directors, I submit our formal request for the EDC fees. I will plan to attend the August 12, 2014 scheduled EDC Board Meeting to discuss our proposal in greater detail or answer any questions.

Economic Development Commission Members,

Thank you for considering Franklin Heritage, Inc. and The Historic Artcraft Theatre's proposal for funds. Our staff has compiled a list of three 'shovel ready' projects these potential funds could complete. The Artcraft Theatre is an economic anchor in our downtown community, and we believe, these upgrades to our facility will expand upon our projected growth.

The three 'shovel ready' projects are as follows:

- 1. Replacing the leaking roof of the theatre's auditorium. (Attachment #1)
 - a. We have a quote from Kammerling Construction to reroof our auditorium with 30 year dimensional shingles totaling \$23,732. With these prospective funds, we hope to complete this project before our busy Christmas movie season.
- 2. Completing a handicap accessible ramp on our 49 E. Madison property. (Attachment #2)
 - a. We have architectural plans completed for a handicap accessible ramp at our 49 E. Madison property. This is the small blue home behind the Willard that serves as our dressing rooms, green rooms, and rental space. This project will fulfill the accessibility requirements for the theatre, allowing all performers/patrons to enjoy the theatre. We will leverage the talents of the Atterbury Job Corps for the labor cost of this project, reducing expenses to minimal lumber & supply costs. \$8,000
- 3. Office renovation at our 48 E. Madison property. (Attachment #3)
 - a. Renovating two existing rooms at our 48 E. Madison property will give us the space required to hire another full time employee by the end of the year. We have plans for custom furniture that will be affordably made by a local woodworker that matches the theme of our theatre. \$3,500




Photo 47 - The roof has an undulating appearance . . .







Photo 48 - . . . especially evident at the peak of the gable.








Handicap Accessibility Ramp

This letter serves as a request for \$5,000 for Franklin Education Connection from the Economic Development Fee fund.

Franklin Education Connection was formed in September, 2013 when Study Connection and the Franklin Community Schools Education Foundation joined forces to better serve the community. Franklin Education Connection (legal name Community Involvement in Learning, Inc.) is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization.

Study Connection, operating since 2005, is a homework/mentoring program which matches adult Study Buddies with students in grades 2-6 who have been identified by school staff as needing assistance in reaching academic and social standards. In the 2013-14 school year, a record 103 Study Buddies provided more than 3,000 hours of volunteer help and support.

The Education Foundation, established in 2010, provides grants to teachers to enhance students' academic experience. Since 2011, the Education Foundation has awarded more than \$34,000 in grants to 29 programs at schools at all grade levels. The Education Foundation has also raised more than \$13,000 to establish Destination Imagination (DI) teams at the elementary and intermediate levels. DI encourages teams of students to use STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) along with fine arts and service learning to solve problems. Teams compete in regional, state and global competitions.

In May of this year, a DI team from Creekside Elementary progressed through their competitions and qualified for Globals (Knoxville, TN) where they competed against 92 teams from around the world. They finished tied for 46th.

Mission Statement: Our mission is to connect Franklin Community Schools to community resources to enhance academic excellence and instill a lifelong love of learning.

Annual operating budget summarized by category: Our annual operating budget is \$65,650. Study Connection Program expenses are budgeted at \$22,550. Education Foundation Program expenses are budgeted at \$17,275. The remaining budgeted amount of \$25,825 covers administrative costs such as insurance, accounting fees, membership fees, public relations and marketing, and contract staff fees.

Description of how funds would be used and for what/Amount of funds requested and a prioritized detailed project budget: We are requesting \$5,000.

The cost of providing Study Connection to one child for the entire school year is \$225. \$2,644 of this grant would be used to provide Study Connection to approximately 12 children.

Education Foundation grants range from \$300 to \$3,000 with the average being \$1,178. \$2,356 would be allocated to providing approximately two grants in the 2014-15 school year.

As you are keenly aware, Franklin Community Schools loses approximately \$1.5 million per year due to Tax Increment Financing Districts and an additional \$2 million per year due to property tax caps. Plus, the school corporation also loses taxes due to abatements.

The quality of Franklin's school system is a significant factor in attracting new businesses. Companies are looking for an educated workforce and schools which are preparing their students for 21st century jobs. Franklin Education Connection works closely with the school corporation to identify academic programs which are moving us from good to great.

Quality schools also attract the employees of these companies. Franklin Education Connection's goal is to convince these workers that their children will receive a quality education that will prepare them to be career and/or college ready. We want people who work in Franklin to live here and add to our vibrant community, and I believe that is your goal as well. Your assistance in achieving our mutual goals would be greatly appreciated.

Unfortunately I will not be able to attend the Commission's August 12th meeting due to a previously scheduled, standing FEC Executive Committee meeting. However, if you have any questions in advance, I would be happy to answer them.
