

REVISED SCOPE:

1 SUMMARY

- A. Original design from one story to two-story design arrived at from direction from committee.
 - 1. Originally design was intended to be on-story version but after meeting with representatives from City of Franklin, owner and owners scope was changed to design a two-story version that would incorporate and elevator from basement to 2nd floor with the possibility of building our apartments on 2nd floor.
 - 2. After finishing two story version and getting bid/ estimates back from two contractors, it was decided the two-story version was too expensive.








- B. It was agreed by owner and committee to do another re-design back to a 1 story version.
 - 1. Owner and committee agreed after first draft of one story version to also find a way to have a small elevator for the one-story version that would go to the basement.
 - 2. The one-story version would try to still incorporate the same appearance in terms of materials and more compatible look relative to the adjacent buildings.

RESULT OF 2ND ROUND OF ESTIMATE/ BIDS 2.3

- 1. After extensive delay getting information to potential bidders no bids were submitted by the December the 8th deadline.
- 2. One bidder did approach the Architect with the idea of changing the project from a Construction Management / Design Build formula. This would be discussed with owner after bids came in.
- 3. With no apparent bids being turned in, currently the Construction Management / Design Build option is being discussed with the owner.
- 4. Depending on Owner, Architect and Construction Management designee negotiations, a new proposal will be turned in to the Redevelopment Commission for consideration. This proposal will be dependent upon all parties being agreeable to the construction management arrangement and the pre-determined price range that will be agreeable to all parties concerned.
