Subject: Approval of Crosswalk art in intersection of Monroe and Jackson Street.

The Public Art Advisory Commission met September 14, 2023 and recommended approval of the Art mural in the intersection of Monroe and Jackson Street. This project has received funding from three sources, a grant from the Indiana Arts Commission, a grant from the Johnson County REMC, and a donation from a private individual.

The purpose of this art is to provide a traffic-calming application that will enhance the area to provide a safer crossing for pedestrians attending events at the Amphitheater. Multiple studies have shown this type of art will reduce accidents between pedestrians and vehicles. In addition, this provides a bright gateway into the amphitheater and sets the tone for the venue. The artist is Nick Abstract from Indianapolis. Mr. Abstract has completed other projects like this in Columbus and Indianapolis.

This art has also been reviewed by City Engineer Mark Richards and Street Superintendent Brett Jones.
