CONTRACT FOR THE PROVISION OF SERVICES BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, INDIANA AND GIRL'S, INC.

This CONTRACT, entered into and on the latter of the two dates below stated, by and between the City of Franklin, Indiana ("City"), by and through its Board of Works and Safety, and Girl's, Inc., is made upon the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The City agrees to make payments to the Girl's, Inc. in the amount of Five Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$5,500.00) on the tenth day of January, 2024 and on the first day of each of the months of April, July, and October of 2024, or as soon as practicable after each of these dates, for a total payment by the City of Twenty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000.00). This agreement is intended to be for a term of one year.
- As consideration for these payments, Girl's, Inc. agrees to use the monies
 received from the City to provide for the needs of the community of Franklin,
 Indiana, as described in the attached Exhibit "A" during the course of the year
 2024.
- 3. Girl's, Inc. agrees to provide the City with a certificate of insurance showing and delineating the City as an additional insured for purposes of liability coverage, with said insurance coverage to be no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00). Further, Girl's, Inc. agrees to hold the City harmless upon and to indemnify the City fully against any and all liability, claims, actions, demands, costs, and expenses (including but not limited to attorney fees, litigation costs, and expert witness fees and expenses) directly or indirectly arising from the conduct, operation, business practice, omissions, or establishment of the Girl's, Inc.

The identity programs are age-appropriate, research-based, and designed specifically to meet the needs of girls such as:


