

**CONTRACT FOR THE PROVISION OF SERVICES**  
**BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, INDIANA**  
**AND GIRL'S, INC.**

This CONTRACT, entered into and on the latter of the two dates below stated, by and between the City of Franklin, Indiana ("City"), by and through its Board of Works and Safety, and Girl's, Inc., is made upon the following terms and conditions:

1. The City agrees to make payments to the Girl's, Inc. in the amount of Five Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$5,500.00) on the tenth day of January, 2024 and on the first day of each of the months of April, July, and October of 2024, or as soon as practicable after each of these dates, for a total payment by the City of Twenty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000.00). This agreement is intended to be for a term of one year.
2. As consideration for these payments, Girl's, Inc. agrees to use the monies received from the City to provide for the needs of the community of Franklin, Indiana, as described in the attached Exhibit "A" during the course of the year 2024.
3. Girl's, Inc. agrees to provide the City with a certificate of insurance showing and delineating the City as an additional insured for purposes of liability coverage, with said insurance coverage to be no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00). Further, Girl's, Inc. agrees to hold the City harmless upon and to indemnify the City fully against any and all liability, claims, actions, demands, costs, and expenses (including but not limited to attorney fees, litigation costs, and expert witness fees and expenses) directly or indirectly arising from the conduct, operation, business practice, omissions, or establishment of the Girl's, Inc.

The “Girls Inc. Experience” consists of people, an environment, and in a girls-only space that is physically and emotionally safe and where girls find a sisterhood of support with shared drive, mutual respect, and high-expectations. Interactive, research-based programs provide girls with the skills and knowledge to set goals, overcome obstacles, and improve academic performance.

The identity programs are age-appropriate, research-based, and designed specifically to meet the needs of girls such as:

**Economic Literacy<sup>SM</sup>:** Girls learn how to budget, save, take informed financial risks, and avoid feeling intimidated about money.

**Discovery Leadership<sup>SM</sup>:** Helps build leadership skills and creates lasting social change by partnering girls and women in community action projects.

**Friendly PEERSuasion<sup>SM</sup>:** Girls develop skills to resist peer pressure to use harmful substances such as alcohol, tobacco, household chemicals, and other drugs.

**Operation SMART<sup>SM</sup>:** Designed to stimulate girls’ interest in STEM -science, technology, engineering, and math. Encourages girls to become involved in the process of inquiry — question, explore, discover, and take risks.

**Sporting Chance<sup>SM</sup>:** Provides quality sports involvement and systematic skill building for girls of all ages. We also utilize, Go Girl Go, a sports/physical activity/wellness curriculum created by the Women’s Sports Foundation.

**Project Bold<sup>SM</sup>:** A comprehensive, research-based program to help girls and young women avoid, address, and cope with violence.

**Media Literacy<sup>SM</sup>:** Encourages girls to think critically about media images and messages.

**Healthy Sexuality<sup>SM</sup>:** Assists girls in understanding and embracing sexuality with a positive, empowered approach that is built on a foundation of accurate information, cultural sensitivity, and values of inclusiveness and respect.

**Literacy Initiative<sup>SM</sup>:** Strives to improve the literacy skills of girls in kindergarten through third grade (K-3) by promoting a love of reading and providing fun and engaging programming that supports the school-based instruction that girls receive.
