Summary of the proposed project (Limited to 700 words)

Franklin Heritage, Inc (FHI) plans to engage a strategic planning consultant to help advise as the organization looks to the future, along with a theater architect specifically for The Historic Artcraft Theatre. Currently, FHI is operating without a strategic plan. With several large-scale challenges on the horizon, the need for a plan to build sustainable growth over the next five years is necessary. The unique structure of FHI complicates the issue of strategic planning, requiring more extensive consultant services than other organizations may require. FHI has three main operations, with overlapping but distinct aims and processes for each. There is the historic preservation arm of FHI's operations, as well as the architectural salvage operation of Madison Street Salvage and the ongoing restoration and operation of The Historic Artcraft Theatre. There are no known comparable organizations that perform all of FHI's functions, so any strategic planning consultant will need to tailor their efforts accordingly. Additionally, the long-term plan for The Historic Artcraft Theatre requires consultation with a theater-specific architect, in order to incorporate necessary upgrades and renovations to the theatre space.

Prior to 2020 and the resulting pandemic, FHI had a record attendance at The Historic Artcraft Theatre, with just under 49,000 patrons attending regular movie series films in 2019. A decade previous, in 2009, the regular film series drew 13,375 patrons. This is a growth of 266%. Post-pandemic, the Artcraft is rebuilding its audience, with patron counts of 39,000 in 2022 and 38,000 in 2023. Current projections have 2024 attendance surpassing the 2022 total. One goal of FHI is to continue sustainable growth at The Historic Artcraft Theatre. Currently, the Artcraft is open for public events an average of 2.3 days a week. A strategic plan will help guide FHI operations to enable the Artcraft to be open more days of the week. This should have an impact on the economics of downtown, as visitors come to the theater. The strategic planning process will also help FHI to better quantify this economic impact. Another goal of FHI is to allow a wider variety of events to be held at the Artcraft. While the theater does well with repertory cinema and the occasional music show, it does not have the audio or lighting capabilities to support major touring acts, or to allow for live theater. Building out these capabilities will be expensive and time-consuming, necessitating a multi-year, cohesive strategy of planning, fundraising, construction and implementation, with coordination between the strategic planner and theater architect.

As a historic preservation group foremost, the ethos of preservation undergirds all of FHI's activities, whether it is its efforts in historic preservation in Franklin, the operation of Madison Street Salvage or the ongoing restoration and operation of The Historic Artcraft Theatre. As a prominent community group in Franklin, the growth and support of the City of Franklin itself is also paramount to Franklin Heritage. As part of the strategic planning process, FHI will be in communication with many other community and civic organizations; these groups will include, but will not be limited to the EDC, Discover Downtown Franklin, Festival Country Indiana, the Creative Council of Franklin, the Franklin Chamber of Commerce, city government, and many others. Additionally, patrons, FHI members, Franklin residents, volunteers and others will be surveyed and listened to. It is expected that these conversations and surveys will indicate areas where FHI can improve service to Franklin residents, or provide for needs which were unknown to FHI previously.

It is estimated that the strategic planning process could take up to six months. FHI's goal is to begin the study in fall of 2024, around September or October, and then have a complete plan ready for dissemination sometime in April of 2025. Furthermore, the continued implementation of the plan is of great importance. FHI will continue to check in with its engaged consultants and architect throughout the lifespan of the plan to ensure it is on track, or if there is need to otherwise adjust accordingly.

How do you plan to specifically measure the success of this project?

The simplest measure of success will be the completion of the initial strategic planning process and the establishment of the plan, to guide FHI to its goals for the subsequent five years. It is important that the plan also be used as a tool to aid the fundraising necessary to complete the restoration and upgrading of The Historic Arteraft Theatre, as well as expanding FHI's preservation efforts in the Franklin community. A specific measure of success will be tracking the amount of days The Historic Arteraft Theatre is open to the public now, versus five years down the road.

Dear Sir or Madam:

This is in response to your request for affirmation of your exempt status.

Our records indicate that by a determination letter issued on June 12, 1986, you were recognized as exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. That letter is still in effect.

You are classified as an organization that is not a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because you are an organization described in section 509(a)(2).

The classification was based on the assumption that your operations would continue as stated in the application. If your sources of support, or your purposes, character, or method of operations have changed, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change on your exempt status and foundation status.

As of January 1, 1984, you are liable for taxes under Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) on remuneration of \$100 or more you pay to each of your employees during a calendar year. You are not liable for the tax imposed under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA).

Organizations that are not private foundations are not subject to the excise taxes under Chapter 42 of the Code. However, you are not automatically exempt from other Federal excise taxes. If you have any questions about excise, employment, or other Federal taxes, please let us know.

Donors may deduct contributions to you as provided in section 170 of the Code. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to you or for your use are deductible for Federal estate and gift tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 2106, and 2522 of the Code.

You are required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, only if your gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000. If a return is required, it must be filed by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of your annual accounting period. The law imposes a penalty of \$10 a day, up to a maximum of \$5,000, when a return is filed late, unless there is reasonable cause for the delay.

You are not required to file Federal income tax returns unless you are subject to the tax on unrelated business income under section 511 of the Code. If you are subject to this tax, you must file an income tax return on Form 990-T, Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Return. In this letter, we are not determining whether any of your present or proposed activities are unrelated trade or business as defined in section 513 of the Code.

Because this letter could help resolve any questions about your exempt status and foundation status, you should keep it in your permanent records.






Madison Street Salvage One man's trash is our treasure

Donations continue to dominate our source of materials that we sell at the shop.




