After the Invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance Dr. Murphy seconded by Mr. Barrow made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 22, 2004. The motion carried. Clerk Treasurer Alexander requested that a statement in the Council Comments of the March 8, 2004 enrolled minutes be stricken, "Mr. Barrow seconded by Mr. Ault made a motion requesting that the Clerk Treasurer pay the dues and to report back at the next meeting." The motion carried. Motion to strike made by Councilman Eggers, seconded by Mr. Ault. The motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Mr. David Weir introduced the resolution, and advised the Council that this request was reviewed by the Economic Development Commission (EDC) in February and March, and the EDC recommended that the Council declare the area an Economic Revitalization Area (ERA) and grant a seven year tax abatement. The expansion at NSK allows for an additional fifteen jobs with an hourly rate between \$15.00 and \$20.00 Mr. Weir requested that the public hearing be placed on the April 12, 2004 Common Council agenda. NSK representatives, Mr. Carl Gildea, Plant Manager, and Keith Remington, Accounting Manager, presented and reviewed a handout prepared for the

Council. Attorneys Karl Sturbaum and R.J. McConnell, of Bose McKinney & Evans, also attended to present on behalf of NSK. Mr. Sturbaum informed the Council that there are two provisions which allow the Council to approve the tax abatement even though the Statement of Benefits was not filed before installation of the production line for which the abatement was being sought. Discussion was held. City Attorney Rob Schafstall summarized a handout he made available to the Council from the City's Economic Incentives Packet:
