#### **Approval of Minutes**

#### **Old Business:**

**Electrical Box Painting Locations – Ken Kosky** – Mr. Kosky, Dave Windisch and Chrissy Robertson walked the art district and determined all electrical box locations. Mr. Windisch presented a PowerPoint presentation of all types and locations of electrical boxes found. The recommendation is to start in the amphitheater area and work out from there. Ms. Richards asked if several of them could become a Leadership Johnson County project where they would also be responsible for funding. There is also a LJC youth academy where a group of students could do one. Mayor Steve Barnett also suggested through the Mayor's Youth Council and Rotary Interact. Joshua Hendrickson advised having a solid idea of what is desired before securing outside group involvement. Ms. Johnston also suggested being in touch with Chip Orner with regards to activity in the amphitheater area.

**Update on Sculptures – Dana Monson** – Dana Monson met with the sculpture designer. He is happy to give full rights for one dollar but asks to be on the committee that designs the metal sculptures. He recommended speaking with C9. He wants the commission to decide what is on the kites, he would solely like to work with the metal design and depiction. He also recommended working with both Franklin High School and Franklin College. The process can begin the first of January. Mr. Kosky felt the small sculptures will have more impact with one or two of the larger metal ones in place outdoors.
