Greg Potter asked about past discussion regarding painting out on to the sidewalk from the alley. Mr. Windisch explained that the alley had been considered for several different uses and is also scheduled for repair in a couple of years. Mr. Potter expressed the thought of color coordination between the mural and any sidewalk art that could take place in the future. Mr. Windisch made a motion for approval of the mural. Ms. Giles seconded. Passed unanimously, 7-0.

Mayor's Youth Council Statue – Tara Payne – The desire for this year's project is to complete a sculpture installation at the new roundabout in front of the high school. They are working with Trent Newport with CrossRoad Engineers. Amelia Tisdale did the sketch of the sculpture design. There are four bears representing the elementary, Custer-Baker, middle school and high school. The scene fits the landscape of the project. There is a tree and kite. They desire it to be a metal sculpture with imbedded lighting. If this is not possible due to budget, there will be at a minimum up lighting. Mr. Newport has also agreed to help as part of the roundabout project. The Council needs recommendations for securing an artist. Mr. Newport needs dimensions and materials by the end of September. They would pay for anchoring and concrete work. The Council would pay for materials and artist. The artist could have creative freedom with the inclusion of the four bears with one wearing graduation hat. Mr. Kosky sent Ms. Payne a couple of artist recommendations. LuAnn Lietz has an artist recommendation she will send.

Franklin College Banner Request – Emily Olibo – Ms. Olibo is the Director of Alumni Engagement and Campus Partnerships and she presented a request for banners on King Street welcoming alumni to campus during homecoming week. Franklin College will cover the entire cost of printing. They do not have a date on them so can be used year to year. Mr. Windisch confirmed that there will be 15 locations. He made a motion for approval. Holly Johnston seconded. Passed unanimously, 7-0.

Old Business:

Strategic Plan – Krista Linke – Senior Planner Alex Getchell finalized the map. Pictures have been added. Goals and sections are complete. Ms. Linke still needs amphitheater and event pictures. There are three additional new projects to include the banners and sign language bike rack she would like to see included.

Subcommittee Designations for 2022-2023 Project – Krista Linke – Ms. Linke stated a desire to divide the board and recruit additional committee members to work on different parts of the strategic plan and the process of updates every three to five years. Mr. Kosky, Dana Monson and Ms. Linke discussed together what the three committees should be.

The Community Art Committee would serve to prioritize art projects, taking advice from the full commission, Mayor Steve Barnett, and the general public. The committee would additionally carry out requests for proposals to artists for the projects. They would lead on ongoing projects and projects under consideration. They would bring recommendations to the full commission for approvals.

The Program Committee would have two main facets. The existing programs to highlight and help market and also identify what community program needs there are. Ms. Linke would also like to include business training for local artists along with working with individual program donations.

The Marketing Committee is to bring attention to the cultural district and the district and community art projects. This committee would also establish and maintain a list of local artists. They would lead in social media and walking tour efforts, promoting the cultural district in general.

Josh Hendrickson entered the meeting at 8:37 a.m.

Community Art Subcommittee – Joshua Hendrickson – He presented the need to move ahead on funding efforts for this committee and also helping to sponsor projects that are already happening such as Porchtober and Canvas Clash. Ms. Johnston expressed full support. Ms. Giles said an artist sponsor for Canvas Clash is \$200. Porchtober sponsorships are from \$500-1,000 per porch for the month of October, and each sponsor will receive an acknowledgement sign and the porch location. Ms. Monson gave a budget breakdown. So far expenditures have been the banner map printing, revised King Street banners, the bicentennial alley and the Artcraft banners at \$619. The Artcraft said they would pay for them. Ms. Monson offered that they are raising funds for their organization and didn't know if the commission would choose to pay for them. Mr. Windisch advised talking about it outside of the meeting. Ms. Monson expressed the need to keep back \$1,000 for the bicentennial banners. The grant \$5,000 is being given back to the commission after the completion of the electrical boxes. It leaves \$10,401 remaining in the account. It needs to be spent or encumbered by year end. Mr. Windisch expressed a desire for a more sizeable sponsorship for both Canvas Clash and Porchtober. Ms. Johnston concurred. Ms. Giles asked about possible micro events. Mr. Hendrickson identified that \$2,000 would be a good starting point for upcoming micro events starting in 2023. Tara Payne reminded that the Mayor's Youth Council will be presenting a request for funding for their project. Mr. Kosky confirmed the youth will be fund raising outside of the commission alone.

Mr. Windisch made a motion for a \$500 sponsorship of Canvas Clash and \$1,000 for Porchtober. Passed unanimously, 8-0.

Electrical Box Art for IDDC Grant – LuAnn Lietz – Images were presented by computer in the meeting. Ten Indiana trees have been chosen and the name of each tree will be part of the art. There will be 10 on one side and 10 on the other side. Some will be fall colors and some will be green. The Jimmy Hendricks design for the amphitheater boxes has changed. It is a take off on Ben Franklin as Jimmy Hendricks. There will also be a version of Jimmy Hendricks setting his guitar on fire in Monterey. The tree boxes will begin after Farmers' Market. There is an eclipse theme for the four boxes by the water tower on the one side. They will be four shades of blue. Mr. Hendrickson made a motion for approval of the project. Christy Raney seconded. Passed unanimously, 8-0.

New Business:

Bicentennial Banner Submissions – Dana Monson – Only one submission has been received. Chrissy Robertson had a couple referrals that could not submit by this meeting. Mr. Hendrickson was in support of securing additional submissions.

Eclipse Art Project – Ken Kosky – This was directed to the Community Art Committee.

Ms. Giles announced October 17 as the new projected date of completion for the bicentennial alley. The footers will now only be surface level. The savings will be used for the seventh steel structure and lighting of the structure. Mr. Kosky suggested the possibility of work on other alleys after this completion.

Ms. Johnston announced the Community Art Show in conjunction with Ethos Celebration of the Arts on October 1. Applications are available online and at Parks and Recreation.

Ms. Raney along with another artist said she was doing a meet and greet at the Bayside Vintage store on October 1 from 2-4pm.

Mr. Kosky advised connecting all these art events to the commission's Facebook page, Franklin Indiana Public Arts Advisory Commission.


Adjournment:
