#### **Committee Reports**

Community Art Committee: Ken Kosky – Much discussion was held with David Pfifer about America's 250<sup>th</sup> celebration next year. Each county is being asked to hold special events. There will be a parade. The committee is continuing to brainstorm. Once the Veterans' Alley wall is completed, maybe a flag could be installed there with a reference to the 250<sup>th</sup>. The 250<sup>th</sup> committee is getting another logo. 2026 banners would be likely. Map cases are still being worked on. The first will be the case on North Main Street.

Programming Committee: Josh Hendrickson — Their meeting was focused on Ethos. The posters are done and being distributed today. There are 47 confirmed and paid artists. There are 27 more confirmed but yet to pay. Featured will be live music, beer and wine garden, a cooling station, Chalk the Block, Secret Garden Walk with Canvas Clash the night before. On Sunday, there will be a jazz brunch at Richard's with live music. Tickets for events are on sale now. The first week of the Farmers' Market had 3600 in attendance. The highest attendance previously was 1800. There are 80 vendors. The second week had 2900. There are signups for working the tent at Ethos. There are 50 rocks left from last year, so these can be featured again this year at the tent.

Nick Crisafulli moved to sponsor the Canvas Clash for \$100. Vicky Noblitt seconded. Passed unanimously, 5-0.
