This agreement is for two primary areas of work

Preparation and submission of Part 1-Evaluation of Significance of a Historic
Preservation Certification Application for the historic Post Office in Franklin, Indiana to
the National Register of Historic Places. This form is commonly called Part 1 of a Historic
Preservation Tax Credit Application.

Work related to this application shall include:

- o Conduct necessary research on the history and significance of the property
- o Determine historic appearance based on historic material and observation
- o Prepare the nomination.
- Take and format necessary photographs
- o Coordinate the nomination process with client and DHPA staff.
- Submit forms
- Attend one meeting with DHPA staff and a maximum of two meetings of the Franklin Redevelopment Commission, if necessary.
- o Provide one paper copy and one electronic copy of the application to the client
- Prepare a short document that can be provided to potential developers, giving a brief
 assessment of the building, diagrammatic floor plans, an outline of the Preservation tax
 credit program, and an indication of what elements of the building should be preserved
 in a renovation project.

There are no other changes to this agreement.
