





Proposed Ordinance Highlights



Named in memory of Blake Dickus for the efforts of his family

Program would be managed by the Police Department

Additional public or private donations can be accepted into the account fund, so the fund can become self-sustaining.

Proposed Ordinance Highlights

Police Chief would be authorized to offer rewards up to \$500.

Mayor would be authorized to increase any reward from \$500 up to \$5000.

City Council would be authorized to increase any reward from \$5000 up to \$25,000 with vote in public meeting.




Proposed Ordinance Highlights

All rewards would be payable upon CONVICTION.

Police Officers and their immediate families would not be eligible for rewards.

No party actively involved in the crime would be eligible.



Conclusion

A Criminal Tip-Line Reward Program would be an excellent tool for the Police Department to help solve "cold case" crimes as well as new cases.

Program encourages citizens to aid the Police by sharing information that would lead to arrests.
